HOW TO ACCESS THE SHOW ON RECORDING DAY FOR GUESTS

We connect and record the show using **StreamYard** on your internet browser. Make sure you have the following:

- A laptop or desktop with a built-in webcam and mic OR a USB attached camera or mic.
- A recent version of Chrome or Firefox.
- A strong internet connection. Just like Zoom, you must have a strong/fast internet connection for it to work well.
- We ask that you wear earbuds or headphones to prevent audio echoes.

If you don't have a laptop or desktop, then you can join on your phone. But the experience and your presentation is usually best on a laptop/desktop. On Android, we recommend the Chrome browser. On iOS, you must use Safari.

When the time comes, follow these steps to enter the broadcast studio:

- 1. The host should provide you with a link before the show. Click the link and you'll be taken to their broadcast studio.
- 2. Allow StreamYard to access your camera and mic.
- 3. Make sure you have the correct camera, High Definition (720p) and audio mic selected. Click the "Settings" button to check.
 - Enter a display name. Use your actual name or the name of your brand. Then enter the studio.
- 4. The host will be informed that you've arrived. You won't be part of the broadcast until the host decides to add you in. The page will update to let you know when you've been added.





TIPS DURING RECORDING FOR GUESTS

- Optimal Internet Speeds: UPLOAD 5+mbps (min 2mbps) and DOWNLOAD 10+mbps. You can use a site like www.speedtest.net to test your internet speeds.
- ⊘ If available, use a USB microphone plugged into your computer/laptop (Best audio). If no USB microphone, your laptop or earbud's internal microphone can also work.
- O Use a USB camera or built-in camera (so we can see you).
- O Use a pair of headphones or earbuds plugged into your laptop to prevent echo.
- Call from a quiet room or office with low ceiling and carpet to prevent background noise. Turn off phone.
- ✓ We have fun in a casual atmosphere! If we had a green room with complimentary drinks before the show, we would let you in. We don't. So, feel free to make/bring your own, join us and have fun!
